SHORT COURSE #1 //

UP AND RUNNING: ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE NOW AND WHAT'S BEEN LEARNED

Wind, run-of-river and other renewable energy projects have been in operation in BC for more than two decades, generating clean electricity but also generating first-hand experience of facility operations and environmental performance. Great technical advances have been made and many early-operations phase environmental monitoring programs are now complete. What do the wind and hydro monitoring program results and direct experience at BC facilities tell us about the real environmental performance of these projects, relative to predictions made during the permitting process? What made-in-BC technical advancements have occurred to mitigate potential environmental effects—construction approaches, operational designs, maintenance protocols, compliance monitoring, compensatory habitat, and site reclamation? Leaders in the industry will present and discuss recent knowledge gained from operating clean energy facilities in BC, and how this experience informs our understanding both in this province and beyond.

SHORT COURSE #2 //

ADVANCING INDIGENOUS OPPORTUNITIES IN CLEAN ENERGY

This full day session invites First Nations and the greater clean energy community to explore ways to develop clean energy in BC. This session will provide the latest information on government programming, and will outline potential pathways for First Nations that are interested in clean energy, have experience in the sector and want to do more, or face challenges in being diesel dependent. This course will also feature information on obtaining financing and finding the right project partners.
